Leslie Albrecht and Christopher Holland

Their investigation uncovered a history of abuse and identified two additional victims. The perpetrator was arrested and charged, highlighting the commitment of Albrecht and Holland to protect vulnerable individuals. Their heroic efforts exemplify determination in addressing difficult crimes and ensuring accountability for perpetrators.







Meghan Basinger

Public Information Specialist III, Missouri State Highway Patrol/Department of Public Safety

Meghan managed the Missouri State Highway Patrol's social media. On August 25, 2022, she received two emails from someone expressing severe depression and suicidal thoughts after a crash but did not reveal their identity. Meghan worked with leadership to identify the individual and crash location, allowing authorities to intervene and provide resources. Despite not having in-depth mental health crisis training, Meghan recognized the woman's need of aid and took the appropriate actions, contributing to the prevention of a potential tragedy.

Stacy has been highly dedicated at the Division of Community and Public Health (DCHP) by leading and training administrative staff. She provided essential tools for remote work during the pandemic and set up temporary workstations for COVID data entry. Les Hall

Sr. Maintenance Worker, Department of Transportation

On March 15, 2022, Les and crew from the Charleston Maintenance Facility, arrived at a business parking lot for clean-up. Suddenly, the crew heard screaming and witnessed a father holding his child as an aggressive dog lunged at them. Les placed himself in harm's way to distract the dog, giving the father opportunity to safely place his child out of the dog's reach. Law enforcement was later able to subdue the aggressive dog thanks to Les's actions. Les humbly stated he did not see his actions as heroic, but just as what any father would do. Jill started her role with the WIC program and DHSS in September 2019, encountering challenges like electronic benefits and the COVID pandemic, which led to shortages of baby formula. Jill's mentoring and support have built teamwork and trust, highlighting her leadership and dedication.

Sergeant Adam Johnson and Corporal Johnathan Roberts

On May 14, 2023, Sergeant Johnson and Corporal Roberts rescued two individuals from the flooded North Fork River, which was significantly swollen due to heavy rain. They first saved an adult female clinging to a submerged tree, who showed signs of hypothermia, and took her to safety. They then returned to rescue a male subject in a similar condition. Both were later hospitalized for treatment. Sergeant Johnson and Corporal Roberts's actions undoubtedly prevented serious injury or death.
